Water Payments

- Due on the 20th of the month.
- All "late" payments received after the due date will be assessed a 10% late fee.
- A \$50 reconnection fee must be paid before water service is restored to a disconnected residence for non-payment.
- Customers that tamper with water service equipment after it has been disconnected will be assessed a \$200 tampering fee.

Notice: Lamar Town Council Gives Permission to Codes Enforcer

At the July 10th Council Meeting, **approval was given** to Alvin Chambers, Darlington County Codes Enforcer and also the Codes Enforcer for the town of Lamar, **to move forward in addressing the town's residences/buildings that have been deemed unsafe, hazardous, etc**.

The owners of these places will receive letters identifying the problem(s) and the consequence(s) if not corrected.

The South Carolina Building Codes will be used for this purpose. Code Enforcement ensures a safe community by enforcing compliance with codes and investigating code violations.



SC Golf Cart Laws

Many people in Lamar have golf carts. They are used for enjoyment but they are also used for running errands. Just like cars have rules and regulations, golf carts have laws that must be followed.

- 1. In SC, you must purchase a golf cart permit. This permit can be purchased at any DMV branch.
- 2. The permit decal must always be visible on the golf cart.
- 3. According to the State Code of Laws, if you have a valid driver's license, you may drive a golf cart during the day within four miles of your home or business.
- 4. No one under the age of 16 is permitted to drive a golf cart.
- 5. No night driving is allowed.
- 6. Proof of liability insurance is required for golf carts. Keep it available.

ELECTION TIME coming

As you can see below, Lamar has two (2) at-large seats for Town Council for this election.

The filing period starts August 1 and ends August 15. Filing location is the Darlington County Voters Registration Office in Darlington.

All voting this time will take place at Town Hall since this is specific to the Town of Lamar. The election date is November 7.




