## ZONING ORDINANCE BOOK Article 6, PAGE 25

6-2 <u>ACCESSORY STRUCTURES</u> No accessory building may be constructed in any portion of a required front or side yard. No accessory structure may occupy more than thirty (30) percent of a required rear yard. No accessory structure may be closer than five feet (5') from any side or rear property line or building.

# TOWN COUNCIL REPORT 2/12

At each Town Council Meeting the four Council Members give reports to demonstrate what services they performed or what information is necessary for distribution to the Town's businesses or citizens for the previous month. They each have a defined area. CODES & BUSINESS –

## Councilwoman Bradley 2/12

\*Business license renewal information is available to business users on the Local Business License Renewal Center Portal at MASC. The business license can also be renewed through Gov.Possible. \*Renewal info will be on the Town's Website and Facebook page. Renewal letters will be mailed around February 19. \*A new business must contact the Town. WATER & SEWER –

#### Councilwoman Lee 2/12

\*In January, water line repairs were made at Spaulding Elementary School (Pearl St.), on Duke St., and on East Jackson St. \*In January, Lamar purchased from DCWSA 4,803,670 gallons of water, billed to customers 2,156,306 gallons, had a water loss of 2,647,364 gallons, and paid to DCWSA \$15,485.11.

\*Water leaks or breaks do not affect customers' personal bills. A water leak on the customer's side of the meter does. \*Information about paying a water bill is listed on the water bill, Town's website and Facebook page, and this newsletter. <u>STREETS & SANITATION</u> –

Councilwoman Mack 2/12 \*If a street light is off/flickering/etc., you may contact the Duke Energy website or report to <u>maryannmack@lamarsc.org</u>. \*The people working on the sewer lines are finding manholes previously covered. \* Lamar received a \$5,000 grant from Duke Energy for purchasing supplies-like a chainsaw-that would be needed for an emergency disaster. Town Admin. Tim Dargan and Councilwoman Mack wrote it. \*It has been noted that a business is "dumping" water on a street frequented by children walking to school. The Council is asked to investigate.

\*A map was given to Council showing the roads in town maintained by SCDOT. The map is to be placed on the website. \*Councilwoman Mack has spoken to Rep. Robert Williams about trying to get a community facility of some type. \*Parks & Rec. Grants are being searched. \*It was noted the ball field on Robinson Road needs enhancements.

#### POLICE DEPARTMENT – Councilman Cook 2/12

\*The LPD submitted a quarterly report to the SCDOC for the LPD grant of \$150,000. Every expense must be reported. \*Watch the speed limits around town. \*Do not text and drive-it is illegal besides dangerous and lethal. \*Contact the Darlington County Animal

Control if you need a trap in your yard. Call 843-398-4011.

\*Dogs running at large are prohibited. \*Use the anonymous tip line to report information – 843-326-1449.
