Zoning Ordinance Book page 5

3-6 RIGHTS-OF-WAY

Right-of-Way easements for streets and roads shall not be considered a part of a lot or open space or front, rear, or side yard for the purpose of meeting lot dimensions or area or yard requirements.

(Check the Zoning Ordinance Book BEFORE making plans for houses, buildings, fences, etc. on your property.)

If you don't believe "May is green and pink and red," drive around the streets of Lamar. I think this spring the flowers and trees in Lamar are the prettiest ever. Our little town with a big vision is very impressive.

Since we need an employee in the Public Works Department, I have been helping with trash pickup. There is one way you can help. Please put your trash in trash bags so that they can be tied and the trash will not spill out. That is easy! Remember trash pickup the last week in May will take place on Tuesday, 5/27, and Friday, 5/30, because of Memorial Day.

Memorial Day, May 26, is a holiday. Town Hall will be closed. This holiday is a federal holiday set aside to honor our U.S. men and women who have lost their lives while serving our country. It is celebrated on the last Monday in May.

Town Council, Tim Dargan, and I are now working on the budget for next year, 2025-2026. Our fiscal year begins in the middle of this year. For information, we will have a Budget Workshop on May 5 @ 6:15 pm. The first public reading of the budget will take place on May 12 @ 6:15 pm. That is a Council Meeting and you are invited to come.

I realize many are trimming flowers and trees at this time. If you have limbs or branches that need to be picked up, the Town caters to average pickup from yard work. We will pick up piles of limbs cut in 4 feet lengths (prefer 3 feet) or less only. However, we will not pick up large piles, like from a tree or huge bushes that were cut down or trimmed. Small trash like straw and leaves must be placed in bags that are tied. All trash must be placed by the street. This type of pickup is on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays each month. Due to lack of manpower, we are behind schedule. Thank you for your cooperation.

The end of school and graduation is coming up. Support our schools and our children.
