Election and Registration

Taken from Darlington Co. Voter R. & E. Info

Offices open in Lamar's Municipal Election on November 4, 2025, are Lamar Mayor and two at large Town Council seats. Candidates who filed for Mayor are James Howell and Inez Lee. Candidates who filed for Town Council seats are Daren Lorenzo and Jessica Myers.

Early voting is from October 20-31 Monday-Friday from $8:30\,\mathrm{am}$ - $5\,\mathrm{pm}$. No Saturday or Sunday voting. Voters from all four municipalities can vote early at either of these locations:

--Darlington Voter Registration & Elections Annex, 135 Cashua St., Darlington --In Hartsville at Jerusalem Baptist Church at 301 S. Sixth St.

If you wish to vote but will be unable to do so on election day or during early voting, you will need to request an absentee-by-mail ballot by going to or calling the Darlington Registration Office at 843-398-4900. The last day for a ballot to be mailed is October 24, so the signed application must be back by that date.

NOTE: ALL LAMAR RESIDENTS VOTING ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 4, WILL VOTE AT LAMAR TOWN HALL. THIS IS A MUNICIPAL ELECTION ONLY.

You must be registered at least 30 days prior to any election in order to vote in that election. For the 2025 Municipal Elec.

- -- the in-person deadline is 5 pm 10/3.
- -- the online deadline is 11:59 pm 10/5.
- --the by mail deadline is 10/6.

If you are 17 and will be 18 on or before November 4, you are eligible to register anytime by the deadline and and can vote in the November 4 Election.

Photo ID is in effect in Darlington

County. When voting in person, you will be asked to show one of the following current and valid Photo IDs:

- --SC Driver's License: Standard or Real ID
- --SC Dept. of Motor Vehicles ID Card
- --SC Voter Registration Card with Photo
- --Federal Military ID
- --U.S. Passport (Includes Passport ID Card)

ORDINANCE

LAMAR TOWN CODE
ARTICLE II. MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

2.201. ELECTION LAWS OF THE STATE TO GOVERN.

All municipal elections shall be conducted in accordance with the election laws of the State of South Carolina as provided in the South Carolina Code of Laws...

2.202. NON-PARTISAN ELECTIONS ADOPTED.

All regular and special elections for the office of Mayor and Town Council, respectively, shall be non-partisan elections. No political party affiliation shall be placed on any ballot for any candidate.
